KPI: Motion should reduce friction, not increase load time

5. UX & Behavior (The Brain)

Trend: AI-assisted, adaptive experiences

- Personalized content blocks by intent - Predictive UI (next-best action suggestions) - Fewer clicks, smarter defaults - Context-aware experiences without creepiness

Baseline: Mobile-first, performance-obsessed, accessibility-compliant

6. Content Strategy (The Message)

Trend: Storytelling over information dumping

- Narrative scroll flows - Section-by-section persuasion - Visual storytelling with real meaning - Short copy + strong hierarchy

Mindset shift: Websites are conversations, not brochures

7. Emerging Patterns (The Edge)
